### **DESCRIPTION:**

The Second Language Studies Program and the Department of Linguistics & Languages at Michigan State University are pleased to offer a STARTALK synchronous online workshop on language-assessment development for teachers of Arabic and Russian. The workshop runs June 7 to 30, 2021, with follow-up components during the 2021-2022 academic school year. By the end of STARTALK CLAP, teacher participants will be able to identify best practices in foreign language assessment, fully implement online assessment tools they developed in the workshop, communicate effectively with students and other stakeholders (for example, parents, supervisors, administrators) concerning assessment processes and results, and share their assessment instruments with colleagues and other instructors of Arabic and Russian.

## ELIGIBILITY:

STARTALK CLAP is open to teachers of Arabic and Russian who will be teaching in U.S. middle schools (6th grade or above), high schools, community colleges, colleges, or universities during the 2021-2022 academic year.

## **PROGRAM FEATURES:**

Program participants receive a *full scholarship*, which includes:

- All course materials mailed in a bound packet to you at your domestic home address toward the end of May, to arrive at your home least one full week before the workshop starts June 7, 2021.
- One graduate-course credit from Michigan State University, which is transcripted and transferable.

# **2021 CLAP SCHEDULE**

Each week, participants will learn about a different type of language assessment as well as develop their own assessment instruments for their classrooms. Additionally, guest speakers from Michigan State will provide insights from their areas of teaching and research expertise.

- Interactive and presentational speaking
- Group oral assessment
- Assessments in Task-Based Language Teaching

- · Presentational speaking in the form of multimodal assessment
- Universal Design for Language Assessment
- Instructed Language Acquisition and Assessment

Multimodal speaking tasks for measuring presentational speaking

#### Week 3 (Mon. June 21, Wed. June 23), 6 to 8 PM Eastern Standard Time

Topics:

- Self-assessments part I
- Assessing heritage language learners

#### Instrument Development:

Oral-skills-based self-assessments for promoting learner agency and for measuring proficiency growth on the ACTFL scale (part 1)

#### Week 4 (Mon. June 28, Wed. June 30), 6 to 8 PM Eastern Standard Time

Topics:

- Self-Assessments part II
- Piloting assessments (alpha testing)

#### Instrument Development:


Oral-skills-based self-assessments for promoting learner agency and for measuring proficiency growth on the ACTFL scale (part II)

#### Fall 2021: Implementation Logistic Sessions

- Participants will pilot (beta test) their tools with their actual language students.
- Participants will meet with CLAP instructors during fall virtual office hours to discuss how the tool implementation is progressing, and to troubleshoot issues.
- In December, participants will share anonymized assessment results with CLAP for evaluation.

#### Spring 2022: Implementation Feedback Sessions

- CLAP instructors, in conjunction with MSU's graduate students in Dr. Paula Winke's spring language assessment class, will analyze test-score data and provide targeted feedback on how well individual items and rubrics are able to assess the Arabic and Russian students' language proficiency.
- Participants will again revise their instruments based on this feedback.
- Participants will also be asked to share their tools with the world by placing them on The Modern Language Association's Commons CORE, an open-source repository for humanities' syllabi, materials, and languagerelated assessments and self-publications.



# HOW TO SIGN UP

Applications are being taken now, and places in and scholarships for the workshop are being given out, competitively, on a rolling basis until 10 Arabic teachers and 10 Russian teachers are fully enrolled. Each teacher-participant must do the following:

- Supply the contact information of one professional reference, preferably your current supervisor at the institution where you teach now, and where you will teach in 2021-2022.
